### Year 4 Residential Visit to Castleton

Our Year 4 pupils had a wonderful time on their residential visit to Castleton, enjoying two nights away from home in the beautiful Peak District. During their stay, the children explored the local area, went fossil hunting, visited the fascinating Treak Cavern where they learned about the famous Blue John stone, and even tried their hand at gem panning.

Outdoor activities were a real highlight, with den building and a blindfolded night line providing both challenge and excitement. 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Thank you once again for your continued support — it truly makes a difference.




## Christmas!
