

## Abbey Road Primary School - PE Funding 2017/18



Abbey Road Primary School provides a wide and increasingly varied range of curricular and extra-curricular sporting opportunities - available to all children - contributing to their health and well-being.

The successful delivery of our PE provision, as well as the valuable (voluntary) contributions of staff and parents, has made Abbey Road a very successful school within Rushcliffe when it comes to competitive sports. We believe that involvement in sport has a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all children.

Our provision is constantly under review and is monitored by Mrs Dussek (PE subject leader) as part of our routine school monitoring processes.

To maintain and further develop the wide breath of sporting/physical activity, we have used our additional PE funding strategically in order to secure longer lasting benefits as well as ensuring children are equipped with essential life skills. We invest well over our 'PE and School Sport Premium' funding in providing our pupils with a range of opportunities. The activities outlined below detail our spending of the "PE and School Sport Premium" for the academic year 2017/18.

For the financial year 2017/18 our funding was circa £19,951

**In July 2017 we were awarded the 'School Games Silver Mark', for the third consecutive year, in recognition of the opportunities available to our pupils.**

Release for Primary Sports Link Teacher to attend local meetings to access local opportunities and CPD	£600 (6 x ½ day)	Links with local sports clubs to result in opportunities within and outside of school for wide range of pupils from different year groups providing access to both competitive and more informal sporting events.
Contribution to Rushcliffe Borough Sports Partnership that organises over 20 competitive inter school events and training opportunities	£700	Promotion of community clubs and pathways to regional representation

Raise the profile of sport in the school and incentivise children to join the club in future years.
Staffing of bike club visit to Hicks Lodge	£360 (1.5 days of teacher + 0.5 TA)	Pupils who have attended weekly cycle club, able to apply skills all day in an adventurous environment
