

Math's Activities Week 4 Money

Activity 1

Warm up

- Sing the money song

- Watch Dougie ordering his coins. Note that the pound coin is the old one' sorry. By overcoming common misconceptions of shape and size, Dougie is able to order the coins by value.

- Show your child the coins from 1p to £2
Get them to put all of the bronze coins together and all of the silver coins together and all of the gold coins together.
Get your child to order the coins by size and then by value.
- If you wish to you could print off the [coin ordering sheet](#) and cut and stick the coins in the correct order.

Activity 2

Warm up

Give your child each of the coins from 2p to 20p and ask them to count out the same amount of pennies.

Try and teach that 2 pennies is worth the same as one 2 pence coin and 5 pence is worth the same as 5 pennies and so on.

Choose the level appropriate for your child.

It is a hard concept to understand that one ten pence coin is worth the same as 10 one pence coins.

Some children understand this and will also understand that 10 pence is the same as two five pence coins.

Every child will be at a different level so don't worry, just keep playing with the coins, recognising them and adding them together to make different amounts.

Warm up

You can write your own price tickets or stick real coins onto paper to make price tickets. [If you wish to print price tickets there are some print off](#). Label up food, toys, clothes etc.

Get your child to find the correct coin to pay for the item.

Get your child to count out the correct number of pennies to pay for the item.

Extra challenge- can your child find different coins to pay for the item e.g. two 5 pence coins to pay for a 10p item
