

How Beaches and Dunes Form

When the tide carries jagged chunks of rock back inland, they are smoothed by being moved across the beach and hit into the cliff face.	Waves attack the coastline. The softer rock is eroded more quickly than the harder rock, forming bays and headlands.	Over time, pebbles are broken down into even smaller fragments called sand.
Large, jagged chunks of rock broken off by the waves are carried out to sea.	Coastal winds blow sand around the beach. It forms into piles called dunes.	As the bay is sheltered, sand is deposited there, forming a beach.
