The Sustainable Development Goals are a call for action by all countries — poor, rich and middle-income — to promote prosperity while protecting the planet.



The United Nations

- Formed in 1945
- 193 member countries
- Provides a way for member governments to discuss issues and solve global problems together.

The sustainable development goals recognize that ending poverty must go hand-in-hand with strategies that build economic growth and address a range of social needs including education, health, social protection, and job opportunities, while tackling climate change and environmental protection.

- Millions of people (mostly children) die from diseases associated with inadequate water supply and sanitation and hygiene.
- Water scarcity and poor water quality and inadequate sanitation negatively impact on the food security, livelihood choices and education opportunities for poor families across the world.
- Drought afflicts some of the world's poorest children, worsening hunger and malnutrition.
