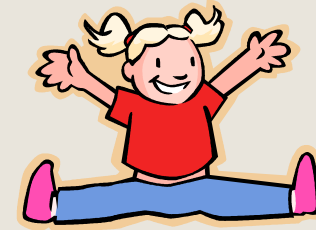

Many action words, verbs, end in **-ed**. This shows that the action **happened** in the past.

For example:

She **jumped** for joy.

This **happened** earlier or some time before.



She **jumps** for joy.

or

She **is jumping** for joy.

This is **happening** now.



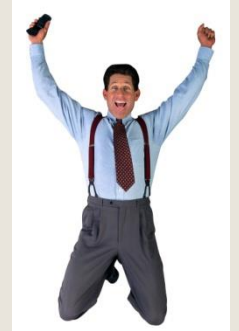
Listen to the endings of these words:
