School Meals

A company called Taylor Shaw will be taking over our catering services from September. I have attached a menu for the autumn term, as well as further information about our new provider.

The process for ordering a school meal will remain the same - children will continue to let their teacher know at registration whether they will be having a school dinner or packed lunch for the week ahead.

If your child requires an alternative menu, due to allergies or other medical reasons, you will need to complete an online form before September. (Any previous forms you have completed, were for NCC and Taylor Shaw have their own procedure.) Please follow the link below:

If you are unsure whether this is required for your child, please refer to the attached guide for parents regarding allergy menus.

The price of school meals will increase to £2.70 per day (£13.50 per week) from Wednesday 6th September 2023. This is in line with what NCC would have been charging if they had remained as our catering provider.

If you would prefer, you can pay in advance for a half term at a time. The amount for the first half of the autumn term is £86.40. Children in Reception & Key Stage 1 still receive universal free school meals.

In between leading assemblies, writing certificates, collecting and reading the lovely 'thank-you for animals' notes, she




pencilled in a number of meetings with friends, and they well and truly took charge of my office. I think she enjoyed her taste of leadership!

Here are the outcomes of our Year 6 statutory assessments for 2023, compared to national standards.

The expected standard in the tests is a scaled score of 100 or above. The range for scaled scores is between 80 and 120. The graph on the left shows the percentage of pupils scoring 100+ (expected standard).

A scaled score above 110 is classed as achieving at a 'higher standard'. The graph on the right shows the percentage of pupils achieving a score between 110 and 120 (higher standard).

These are excellent results, and we are very proud of each and every member of the year group as they all worked incredibly hard to make excellent progress and achieve their very best.
