Thank you for all of your support and for your delightful children who really are a credit to you all. They are all doing so well, making good progress and enjoying their learning. This half term our topic is Winter Wonderland. We will be covering the following areas...

Understanding the World

We will be learning about how Hindu's celebrate Diwali.

We will be learning about ice melting.

We will be investigating how polar bears keep warm.

We will be learning about the different animals that live in the Arctic and the Antarctic.

<u>Literacy</u>

We will be practising letter formation and letter sounds and blending them together to read and write words.

The children will be practising their names with correct letter formation.

The children will write simple three letter words.

Some children will start to write simple sentences.

We will be playing in Santa's grotto and writing good lists and labels for presents.

We will be writing for different purposes including a letter to the zookeeper.

<u>Reading</u>
